- **Shared Living:** Choose a compatible family or individual to live with and receive support.
- **Respite Care:** Get support in your home while family or friends are away.

Day Supports

- **Day Programs:** Connect with other people, participate in fun activities and attend local events.
- **Vocational Training:** Get involved in the community through volunteering and other opportunities.
- **Retirement Services:** Receive guidance to transition smoothly and experience a fulfilling life after retirement.
- **Job Development:** Work with an employment specialist to apply for and secure a paid job.
- **Job Coaching:** Receive individual support on the job site to thrive in your new career.
- **Nebraska Vocational Rehabilitation Collaboration:** Get detailed benefits counseling and training as requested from Nebraska VR.
